International Scientific Exchange Programme

The International Council of Scientific Unions and UNESCO have just set up a new joint programme aimed at promoting international cooperation in science by enabling scientists, from developing countries, to carry out short-term studies in well-established scientific centres and

to learn and use techniques not accessible to them in their own countries.

Candidates must already be engaged in research, return to their country of origin upon termination of their fellowship and produce evidence that the theoretical and practical knowledge or training to be acquired in the foreign laboratory will be beneficial to their scientific development.
